

Welcome to the August Wayne DuPage Horse Trials!

We are so very glad you will be competing this weekend.

Please read this ENTIRE PAGE carefully!

NO PACKET WILL BE GIVEN TO:

- ANY RIDER that does not have their horse's CURRENT COGGINS ON FILE WITH THE HORSE TRIALS. (Drawn AFTER August 16, 2009) If you haven't already sent one to the show secretary, **DO NOT** SEND IT NOW. **BRING IT TO THE SHOW** OFFICE WHEN YOU CHECK IN. Even if your horse is NOT being stabled, you **STILL** need a current Coggins on file.
- Junior riders that do not have a parent or guardian's signature on the FOREST PRESERVE WAIVER. Juniors must have a parent with them when they pick up their packet **OR PRINT THE WAIVER FROM THE WAYNE DUPAGE WEBSITE AND THE JUNIOR MAY BRING A SIGNED COPY TO THE OFFICE WHEN THEY CHECK IN.**
- Junior riders that do not have a parent or guardian's signature on the USEA signature/waiver page. **THE JUNIOR MAY BRING A SIGNED COPY TO THE OFFICE WHEN THEY CHECK IN.** Page **MUST** HAVE **FOUR** SIGNATURES (RIDER, OWNER, TRAINER and PARENT.) The TRAINER is the adult responsible for the care of the horse.

STALL CLEANING DEPOSIT/PER STALL

- If you are stabling, PLEASE bring \$25.00 CASH/per stall to the show office when you check in.

BEDDING

There is no initial bedding. You **MUST** pre order shavings **NO LATER THAN SATURDAY AUGUST 14 BY 2:00** from *Bob's Salt and Feed* to be delivered **SUN AM.** Call ahead to reserve shavings.

REMEMBER we are guests of the DuPage County Forest Preserve and their rules must be respected in order for us to continue to use the forest preserve for equestrian activities.

No alcohol in the forest preserve

No camping or overnight stays in the forest preserve

Only motorized vehicles with a placard, authorized by Wayne DuPage Horse Trials, on XCC

PLEASE NOTE: Competitors wishing to do so may opt to wear boots, britches and gloves, as applicable for the test being performed, with a long or short sleeved shirt with collar, without neckwear, of a conservative color, neatly tucked into riding breeches for all three phases of the one day show rather than traditional show attire.

Protective headgear and protective vests are required as applicable for test being performed.

Competitors wishing to do so may wear traditional show attire for any phase.
